ANSLEY, NE - Both teams entered the contest with spotless 12-0 records, but it was Ansley's ace Quarterback, future Hall of Famer- Carl Ostrand who ran for a pair of touchdowns and threw for another behind fellow Hall of Famer Jim Scott. The Warriors overwhelmed the visiting Panthers 40-14 as Ansley scored the first two times it touched the football. 1,000 yard rusher Pete Rhode's run from 11 yards out and Ostrand's 26 yard scoring strike to Dana Thompson got it going.

Bancroft-Roaslie did counter in the second quarter on 1 yard scoring run by Brian Tietz, but the hometown Warriors won their second state title in three years by scoring the next 20 points, extending their lead to 34-6 after three quarters.

Ansley piled up 312 rushing yards, on their way to outgaining Bancroft-Rosalie 438 to 162 in the game. Hall of Fame running back Brent Gatzemeyer had been out with an ankle injury for the Panthers, but was slated to play in this game. However, the Panthers could muster just 90 rushing yards for the game.

Coleridge, led by Head Coach Randy Heubert, had touchdowns from Brant Anderson and a 59 yard pass reception by Scott Gray (from Jon Heitold). Gray, who ended his career with 5,632 rushing yards on his way to the Hall of Fame, led all rushers in this game with 150 yards on 22 carries.

St. Pats apparently believed the third time was the charm after losing in the D-2 State Title game the two previous seasons.
