

TRAVIS MLADY – BLOOMFIELD HIGH SCHOOL

From 1998 to 2001, Travis starred as a "lightning-in-a-bottle" running back for legendary Coach Gary Walling. In his electrifying senior campaign, he led the Bees to 12 straight victories and a Class D-1 State Runner-Up finish. While averaging almost 11 yards per carry, Travis raced for 2,353 yards and 52 touchdowns during that campaign. His efforts were recognized and honored by multiple media outlets including: 1st Team All-Conference and All-District, 1st Team All-State, Class D-1 Offensive Player of the Year, and he was selected to the All-Class/All-Nebraska Football Team. In the summer of 2002, Travis was chosen to play in the 8-Man All Star Game, where he was honored as that game's Most Valuable Offensive Player (scoring 3 touchdowns in the game- a record at the time). He later continued his career at The University of South Dakota where he played a major role for the Coyotes 2005 NCC Conference Championship team. Travis finished his prolific college career with 1,765 yards, 29 touchdowns, and averaged over 6 yards per carry. He is most proud of the part he played in the Bloomfield Football tradition and working alongside outstanding teammates and coaches.
