### Champion: Shelby (12-0), Head Coach - John O'Brien

Shelby twice overcame Lawrence's double-digit leads, scoring on kickoff and interception returns in a 36-31 win at home. Hall of Fame coach John O'Brien's team won the Huskies one and only state football title after trailing 25-14 with 3:31 left in the 3rd stanza, Coach O'Brien's squad reeled off three straight touchdowns to post the come from behind 36-31 win in the Eight-Man 1 championship game over a great Lawrence team led by Hall of Fame Coach Curt Johnson.

Shelby's 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter scoring spree started with a 21 yard TD pass from QB Steve Alt to Randy Moon. Dave Myers added the conversion run, cutting the Lawrence lead to 25-22. Barely a minute later, the Huskies Bob White pirated an Ed Karmazin pass and returned it 26 yards for the game changing score. Another Myers double extra point run gave Shelby a 30-25 lead. Steve Alt then snuck into the end zone on a one yard plunge early in the 4th to give the Huskies a 36-25 advantage.

Illustrating how quick Karmazin can strike with his arm, the Lawrence rifleman guided his Panthers to a score in just two plays. Starting at their own 22 following a Shelby punt, Karmazin connected with All-State End Ron Ziggafoos for a 35 yard gain, then followed it with a 23 yard TD pass to Mark Herz. That closed the gap to 36-31 but the clock read 1:57 left in the game. A pair of plays sealed the Lawrence comeback fate when Shelby's Bob White recovered the ensuing onside kick following the Panther's TD pass, then the Lawrence defense was flagged with a roughing the kicker penalty with 50 seconds left (allowing Shelby to then runthe-clock-out).

## Champion: Madrid Wheatland (11-1), Head Coach - Jack Sunderland

Wheatland's Nick Ross ran for a pair of touchdowns and passed for two more in the Spartan's 42-14 victory over Decatur. Ross, who was the state's 6th leading rusher with his 1,520 yards, accounted for 175 yards on 33 carries and broke open a tight game in the third quarter by tossing a pair of scoring passes to senior teammate Carey Cook. The TD strikes covered 66 and 18 yards, lifting Wheatland to a 24-14 lead at the time.

The Spartans amassed 394 yards of total offense in the game and won their 2nd state championship under Hall of Fame coach Jack Sunderland (their initial one coming in 1976). Decatur, who was just 5-2 entering the playoffs, reeled off postseason victories over Hordville (54-14) and Odell (26-6) leading up to the D-2 title matchup with Wheatland. The Bulldogs defense shut down two outstanding running backs during that run, Hordville's Todd Tyler (1,238 yards) and Odell's Kelly Haecker (1,119 big ones). Both were juniors.
